Hall's hardy almonds are great and easy plants to grow. They are fast growing and can produce up to 15 lbs of nuts when mature. These trees can start producing after the 3rd year. Fairly disease and pest resistant, but they will need some protection from late spring frosts.

WALNUT

This late blooming variety of walnut is best suited for Oregon climates. It can grow very large so you will want to be sure to plan for plenty of room. Walnuts may start to produce after 5 or 6 years but are not considered mature until after 10 years. Be sure to plant these in a spot where the soil drains well and where the roots can grow deep. As well, you may have to protect them from early fall or late spring frosts.
