Grapes are self-fertile. Only one cultivar is necessary.

<b>Aurore</b>	Mid to late August	Large	Large, loose clusters	Pinkish-white	Very sweet fruity flavor.	Makes a delicate white wine. Good fresh eating, juice and wine.
<b>Buffalo</b>	Ripens early Sept., 20 days before Concord.	Medium	Medium large, well filled compact clusters	Bluish-black	Spicy-sweet, vinous non-foxy flavor.	Excellent for table use, juice & jelly. Makes a very fruity wine. Marvelous grape aroma.
<b>Cabernet Sauvignon</b>	Late	Small-medium	Loose, medium size clusters	Purplish to black	Strong flavor.	Makes distinctive red Bordeaux type wines.
<b>Campbell's Early</b>	Early September	Large	Large	Dark purplish-black	High quality.	Excellent for fresh eating and juice.
<b>Chardonnay</b>	Early to Mid	Small	Small clusters	White	Juicy	Makes dry white wines.
<b>Chenin Blanc</b>	Late Sept. to early October	Medium	Medium, compact clusters	Yellow-green	Juicy	Makes sweet dessert wines and sparkling wines. Consistent producer.
<b>Concord Seedless</b>	Mid-September	Medium to large	Medium sized clusters	Bluish-black	Excellent distinctive flavor.	<b>Seedless.</b> Used for fresh eating, juice, jelly, baking and wine.
<b>Gewurz-traminer</b>	August	Small	Small-medium compact clusters.	Pinkish-red	Spicy floral taste with nutty tones.	Produces excellent pale to rich yellow color 'white' wine. Great for fresh or canned juice.
<b>Glenora Seedless</b>	Late August to early September	Small to Medium	Medium to large, loose, heavy, well-filled clusters.	Bluish black	Sweet, spicy & highly flavored flesh.	<b>Seedless.</b> Superior quality.
<b>Himrod Seedless</b>	August	Medium	Large, long, loose clusters.	Golden yellow	Sweet, delicious, juicy flesh.	<b>Seedless.</b> Fine quality table variety. Sweet juice with delicate flavor. Makes excellent raisins.
<b>Interlaken</b>	Mid-August	Small to medium	Medium, fairly tight, varying clusters.	Golden	Crisp & meaty sweet flesh. Pleasant tangy flavor.	<b>Seedless.</b> Fine for fresh eating. Excellent for raisins.
<b>McCampbell</b>	Early	Large	Large	Blue-black	Sweet, juicy.	Good for juice, jams, jelly, and fresh eating.

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<b>Merlot</b>	August to September	Medium	Large clusters.	Blue-black	Aromas and flavors of plums and black cherries.	Produces large yields of high quality ruby-red wine with lush mouth feel.
<b>Muller Thurgau</b>	Early	Small	Small-medium clusters.	Green	Spicy flavor.	Produces a good White Riesling type wine.
<b>Muscat Ottoneil</b>	Early	Medium	Medium	White to pale green	Dry, fruity, musky.	Great for dessert wines and table grapes
<b>Niagara</b>	Late September	Large	Large, tight, compact clusters.	Light green to white	Very sweet taste with delicate flavor.	Top eating table variety. Makes a distinctive white wine. Also, use for juice, jams & jellies.
<b>Pinot Blanc</b>	Mid-season	Medium	Medium sized clusters	Yellow-green	Very much like Chardonnay wine	Produces crisp and refreshing white wines. Great for fresh eating
<b>Pinot Gris</b>	Early	Small-medium	Compact clusters	Color from copper yellow to pinkish gray.	Complex fruit flavors of peach and melon.	Honey colored, richly flavored wine. Great with salmon. Also known as Pinot Grigio in Italy.
<b>Pinot Noir</b>	Early	Small	Compact clusters.	Dark blue	Complex flavors that are fruity, floral and spicy.	Oregon's Pride. Produces award winning wines. Very distinctive flavor.
<b>Steuben</b>	Mid September	Very large	Long, slender compact clusters.	Blue to purplish black	Sweet with distinctive spicy flavor	Very good table grape. An excellent red wine.
<b>Suffolk Red</b>	September	Medium	Long, loose, medium to large clusters.	Bright red to grayish pink	Juicy, spicy-sweet flavor.	<b>Seedless.</b> Excellent quality. Delicious eaten fresh or as a dessert.
<b>White Riesling</b>	Late harvest	Small to medium	Compact winged clusters	Greenish yellow	Aromatic, lively flavor.	Makes a classic, flowery, semisweet to sweet white wine.
